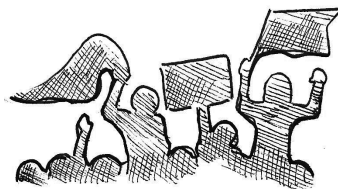


Journal of Civil and Human Rights

JCHR is published with the support of Sonoma State University.

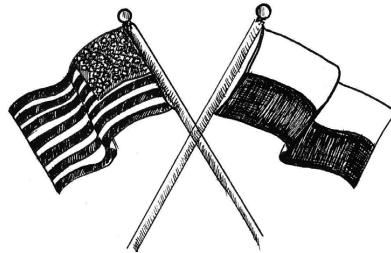

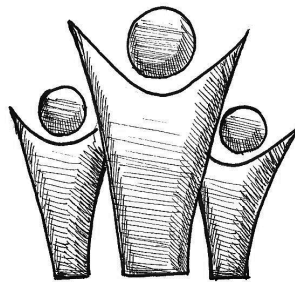


Women, Gender, and Families of Color

3. the fostering of closer relations between persons interested in Scandinavian studies.
